ments for his new cooking show, *Culinary Encounters*.

Traveling with two metal briefcases – one full of spices and recipes, the other for his harmonica – Ciao and his camera crew cooked at the Rossmount Inn and checked out the lobster (or, as Johnny says in his Italian-New Yawk accent, "lobstah!") fishing

and processing industries on Deer Island. The footage will become part of the Culinary Rocker's new TV show that was recently picked up for syndication in the U.S.

"It's a combination of the Travel Channel, Food Network and MTV," said Ciao, who crackles with so much energy his shock of salt and pepper hair must be permanently spiked. Ciao talks (tawk) about stew the way a teenage boy would gush about Lindsay Lohan; even during a break in filming he has a tough time sitting still as he gets pumped up about

his show.

"It brings music food and travel together. I'm traveling and interviewing some of my great, legendary rock 'n' roll friends," he said.

Ciao has been cooking for celebrities for 25 years, something that spun out from his career as a radio DJ, concert promoter and manager, melded with his passion for food. He's fed a long list of stars, including Michael Jackson, Gregory Peck, Marlon
